HB1565 - SA3	Raises the MO HealthNet asset limits for disabled persons	NO	Amendment to expand Obamacare
HB1631	Requires a person to submit a specified form of photo identification in order to vote in a public election with specified exemptions	YES	Statutory implementation of Photo ID
HB1891	Prohibits any public employee from being required to pay dues or other fees to a labor organization - Veto Override	YES	Paycheck protection
HB1979	Imposes a six-month rule for lobbying by former members of the general assembly, by former statewide elected officials, and by former holders of an office that required senate confirmation	YES	Ends revolving door practice
HB1983	Specifies that no statewide elected official or member of the General Assembly shall serve as a paid political consultant	YES	Ends practice of working for other statewide/general assembly members

SB586	Modifies the definition of "current operating expenditures" and "state adequacy target" for the purposes of state funding and applies the definition of "average daily attendance" to charter schools	YES	Updates education funding formula
SB591	Modifies provisions relating to expert witnesses	YES	Requires witness to actually be an expert
SB623	Raises the tax on motor fuel from 17 cents to 22.9 cents per gallon	NO	Raises gas tax with a vote of people without requiring any vision from MODOT
SB847	Modifies provisions relating to the collateral source rule and provides that parties may introduce evidence of the actual cost, rather than the value, of the medical care rendered	YES	This bill limits the evidence of actual damages to the amount actually paid as opposed to the amount of the original billing. For example, if the plaintiff was billed for \$100,00.00 by the hospital, which then accepted \$50,000.00 from plaintiff's health insurance company in full satisfaction of the bill, the plaintiff's evidence at trial of his obligation to the hospital would be limited to \$50,000.00.
